### **EVALUATION DESCRIPTIONS:**

**Participation in Discussion Forums:** Students will post a response to a question related to the weekly concept in the discussion forum. Full marks will be given for excellent quality responses to all concepts. Posts will demonstrate critical thinking and insightful application of nursing knowledge.

## **Clinical Reasoning Assignment:**

Students will demonstrate the ability to apply concepts in order to advance patient care in the acute care setting, demonstrate clinical reasoning skills at the advanced beginner level and demonstrate competent clinical judgement skills. Student's will select a patient case study from a variety of options and will apply the nursing process using the template found on myClass.

**Midterm Exam:** Content covered includes all preparatory work on myClass and the COPE sheets and will include all concepts covered before the reading break.

**Final Exam:** Content covered includes all preparatory work on myClass and the COPE sheets and will include all concepts covered after the reading break. This exam will be scheduled according to the GPRC Final Exam Schedule.

Exams are multiple choice, supervised on Zoom and may utilize Lock Down Browser and/or Respondus to protect the integrity of the exam.

The assignment is marked as a raw score according to the percentage weight assigned to each. The marks on the course assignment will contribute to the overall letter grade according to the percentage that each assignment is weighted in the course. The FINAL COURSE GRADE is based on the cumulative total of individual student's weighted assignment marks.
